

**Andraž Petrovčič**, Ph.D., is a lecturer at the *Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Ljubljana* (Slovenia), where he works as a teaching assistant on undergraduate and graduate courses on social sciences data collection and analysis as well as on internet-related phenomena. Main fields of his work so far are the uses of ICTs for social support exchange and interpersonal communication in personal networks, the study of interpersonal trust and social cohesion within the online communities, and particularly the analysis of outcomes and determinants of psychological empowerment in online health communities. An important part of his research activities on online communities is recently devoted to the methodological issues related to the deployment of web surveys in online communities with a special consideration on strategies for recruitment of participants. As a research fellow at the *Center for Social Informatics* of the *Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Ljubljana*, he has participated in a number of national and international projects addressing various aspects of the development of information society in terms of the role of the internet in lifelong learning, people's everyday life, and digital (in)equality. He is the author of several book chapters and articles published in international journals such as *Quality & Quantity*, *European Journal of Communication*, *Online Information Review*, *Javnost – The Public*, *Slovenian Journal of Public Health*. He is a coeditor of a book entitled *Interacting with Broadband Society* published by Peter Lang (Frankfurt am Main) in 2010.
