

Gregor Petrič, Phd is an assistant professor and a head of the Center for methodology and informatics at the Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Ljubljana (Slovenia). He plays an important part in the sustaining of Social informatics programme at the University of Ljubljana and lectures various topics on the undergraduate and graduate levels: Introduction to social informatics, Internet and Society, Research Seminar, Web design. He supervised numerous students for their bachelor or masters degree. He has been interested into internet technologies and their social impact since the beginning of the 1990's, while currently his research focuses on three wide areas: internet-related social phenomena (online communities, online social action, empowerment, online communication and interaction), research methods (web survey design, measurement quality, causal models, social network analysis), and sociology of science (development of social informatics, quantification). He recently published his work in scientific journals Cyberpsychology, Behavior and Social Networking, European Journal of Communication, Online Information Review.
